





### Aboriginal Report – How Are We Doing Report 2022-2023


- ▶ This is an annual data report from the Ministry of Education and Childcare one for all students and one for "Aboriginal students".
- ▶ The MOECC is in the process of updating terminology from Aboriginal to Indigenous to ensure standardized nomenclature.
- ▶ Once a student has self-identified as being of Aboriginal ancestry, the student is included in all reported outcomes, regardless of program participation from year to year.



### Comparison – Numeracy Grade 4/7

- Grade 4 Numeracy Assessment:
  - Continued strong participation rate
  - Persistent achievement gap between Indigenous and non-Indigenous learners in On Track & Extending (48% vs. 65%)
- Grade 7 Numeracy Assessment:
  - Continued strong participation rate
  - Persistent achievement gap between Indigenous and non-Indigenous learners in On Track & Extending (43% vs. 53%)

- Five Year Completion Rate for Indigenous learners has increased 14.7% over 5 years (65.4% in 2018/2019 to 80.1% in 2022/2023)
- Five Year Completion Rate for non-Indigenous learners has increased 7.2% over 5 years (80.2% in 2018/2019 to 87.4% in 2022/2023)

The six-year completion rate is the percent of Grade 8 students who graduate with a B.C. Certificate of Graduation ("Dogwood") or a B.C. Adult Graduation Diploma ("Adult Dogwood") within six years from the first time they enrol in Grade 8, adjust for migration in and out of B.C. The following chart re-calculates the completion rate without the Adult Dogwood recipients.

#### Comparison – 6-Year Completion Rates

- Six Year Completion Rate for Indigenous learners has increased 10.7% over 5 years (76.0% in 2018/2019 to 86.7% in 2022/2023)
- Six Year Completion Rate for non-Indigenous learners has increased 4.4% over 5 years (85.8% in 2018/2019 to 90.2% in 2022/2023)
- Six Year Completion Rate with Adult Dogwood removed for Indigenous learners has increased 14.3% from 66.8% in 2018/2019 to 81.1% in 2022/2023)

### SLS – Learning about Indigenous Peoples – Grade 4, 7, 10, and 12

- ▶ On the Student Learning Survey, students are asked if they are learning about Indigenous Peoples at school. In this category, the data reflects students reporting that they are learning "Many Times" or "All of the Time".
- ▶ In the curriculum, Indigenous content is required to be embedded in every grade, in every content area.

### Planning Considerations

- ▶ Completion rates are the best they have ever been, which we believe can be attributed to Success Teacher academic support in every school and Principal/Vice Principal commitment to supporting Indigenous student attendance and achievement. If we don't support younger students, we are concerned that these rates will not continue to climb.
- FSA results, particularly for Numeracy, are concerning. The new DPIE will work closely with elementary IEW's to build their capacity in supporting students with these skills.
- ▶ Grade 4, 7, 10, & 12 students report that they are learning about Indigenous peoples at concerningly low rates, considering that there is a requirement to include content. We believe that teachers need more support integrating the content and hope to increase Helping Teacher time from targeted funds next year.
